



Should a Rotarian or Rotex become aware, formally or informally, of any of the following situations or any other situations that adversely affect an Inbound's or Outbound's exchange, health or living situation, they should report it to District 5230 YEP leadership immediately. This list is not all-inclusive and any other concerns about a student should also be reported.

Personal Safety

- Sexual, physical or psychological abuse of any kind
- Uncomfortable and/or unwanted sexual situations
- Bullying at school, in the community or in a host family
- Inappropriate advances or attention from a host parent, host sibling, Rotarian, Rotex, teacher or any other person of authority over the student
- Any thought of suicide or harming themselves in any way

Adjustment

- Severe homesickness
- Excessive contact with home country, be it family or friends
- Failure to disconnect from home and/or failure to engage with host family, school or community
- Depression and/or withdrawal from social activities
- Severe isolation or loneliness, i.e. no friends or connections at school or in the host community

Host Club

- Being ignored by, or no interaction with, host Rotary Club, Club Counselor or YEO
- Failure to receive monthly stipend from host Rotary Club

Personal Behavior

- Failure to learn host country language
- Partying
- Failing classes at school
- Skipping classes/not attending school
- Unauthorized travel
- Romantic relationship(s)
- Sexually promiscuity
- Any dangerous, self-destructive or illegal behaviors
- Use of prescription drugs not provided by a District 5230 approved physician or pharmacy OR medications that were brought with the student from the home country without a doctor's prescription.
